Title IX Counter-Terrorism and Defense Against WMD

WEAPONS OF MASS DESTRUCTION CIVIL SUPPORT TEAMS

The conference agreement provides \$35,000,000 to fully equip and train 22 additional highly specialized Army National Guard WMD–CST Teams. To date, a total of 32 teams have been authorized by the Department of Defense, although 22 of those teams have unfunded equipment and training requirements necessary to bring them up to fully certified status. These funds are provided to fill those critical equipment and training gaps as follows:

22 Mobile Analytical Laboratory Systems (special purpose vehicles)	\$18,500,000
Dismounted analytical suites	6,500,000

The conference agreement includes a general provision (Section 302) which amends a similar provision proposed in the supplemental request, and in the House and Senate bills, which allows funds in the appropriations account “Support for International Sporting Competitions, Defense” to be used to reimburse members of the National Guard while performing State active duty or fulltime National Guard duty, and temporarily waives the requirement to obtain certification from the Attorney General for the Department’s assistance to the 2002 Winter Olympic Games in order to meet safety and security needs.
