

SEPARATION OR RETIREMENT FROM AGR PROGRAM

OPTIONS FOR GENERAL OFFICER NOMINEES

AUTHORIZED FOR GOL OR AGC

AGR officers with 20 years Active Federal Service (AFS) or more:

1. Transfer from AGR to M-Day officer; defer the retirement annuity and execute the Certificate of Eligibility for brigadier general.
2. The officer may file for active duty retirement annuity upon termination of active status.
 - If under age 60, will have retired ID card and pay at the highest grade held satisfactorily on active duty.
 - Upon reaching age 60, the officer has the option of retaining the active duty retirement or converting to a Reserve retirement at the highest grade held satisfactorily while in an active status (M-Day).

AUTHORIZED FOR AGC ONLY

1. Retires and applies for active duty retirement. Assigned to Retired List and draws retirement annuity. State requests return to active status as The Adjutant General or the Assistant Adjutant General. The appropriate state authority forwards nomination memorandum for officer to meet the General Officer Federal Recognition Board (GOFRB).
2. Officer will remain in retired status drawing pay until receiving Senate confirmation. At that time, contingent upon a Secretarial finding of indispensability, the officer will be appointed in the ARNGUS in the grade of brigadier general. The officer must forfeit one day of retired pay for every day of Federal pay received.

GENERAL INFORMATION

AGR officers with less than 20 years AFS:

1. Hold AGR position until 20 years AFS is obtained and proceed as indicated above.

OR

2. Transfer from AGR to M-Day and proceed with standard GOFRB processing.

NOTES

1. Officers can not receive Federal recognition as a brigadier general while in any type of leave status.

2. A copy of DD 214 is required to receive Federal recognition orders.

3. Officers with Certificates of Eligibility can not be placed on the Wait List for GOL headspace until they fill a general officer position.

4. Officers who apply for retirement (move to Retired List) subsequent to a GOFRB void any action of the board.
