Duties:

Principle advisor to the Commander, US Central Command for implementation of the Joint Strategic Planning System

Responsible for the preparation of joint operational plans, documents, and studies on current and future military strategy

Provides recommendations on political-military matters, nuclear, biological and chemical policy, nations assistance programs, arms and technology transfer policy, national disclosure issues, and service programs affecting joint matters

Responsible to develop and update Command Strategy in support of National strategic policy

Develops and coordinates policy, funding, and integration of USCENCOM's Peacetime Engagement Program with NATO, SACLEUR, the New Independent States (NIS) of the Former Soviet Union and other state signatories to NATO's Partnership for Peace Program (PfP)

Maintains fiscal (Warsaw Initiative Funding Only) and policy oversight of the CONUS based portion of the National Guard Bureau's State Partnership Program (SPP) linking US states with "partner nations"

Responsible for the planning and distribution of Tomahawk Cruise Missile missions in support of National Command Authority and JCS objectives

Oversees the targeting, mission production and worldwide distribution to Tomahawk Navy platforms as well as appropriate command and control nodes, in response to tasking by Unified Commanders

Provides recommendations and develops policy guidance on Active and Reserve Component integration and mobilization; and provides recommendations on force structure, assignment, apportionment and strategic deliberate planning for assigned Total Force units

Supervises the Time-Phased Force and Deployment Data development, validation, maintenance and management for operation plans, contingency operations and exercises

Oversees the deployment of Joint Operational Planning System (JOPES) procedures, policy and system requirements for USCENCOM

Provides recommendations and develops policy on matters pertaining to: arms control, security assistance, peace operations, military support to civil authorities (MSCA), military assistance for civil disturbances (MACDIS), weapons of mass destruction (WMD), humanitarian assistance and foreign disaster relief (HA/FDR) and other aspects of national security to include international drug interdiction.

Prepares coordinated military positions on projected and ongoing international negotiations that affect regional security

Makes recommendations on the evolution of the JOPES and Global Command and Control System (GCCS)

9. **Special Qualifications/Requirements/Restrictions:**

Top Secret/SI/TK clearances required

Member may be required to forward deploy as necessary in support to USCENTCOM's wartime mission

Position is critical to all aspects of USCENTCOM's operations

Career broadening experience in policy/planning, international/political military affairs, or command, control, and communications areas are desirable

Must possess a well-grounded working knowledge of Joint Service roles and capabilities, and knowledge of Total Force planning

Upper level and intermediate, joint and/or service school graduates or masters and /or doctorate-educated officers in international relations, national security or other analogous studies are preferred

Must have 17 years satisfactory service

This position is M-Day/drill status only

Must be able to complete a minimum 3 years in the assignment before mandatory removal date/mandatory separation date (MRD/MSD)

Completion of senior service school required

Must be Federally recognized in the authorized grade (line), hold a Certificate of Eligibility for the authorized grade (line), pending Senate confirmation in the authorized grade, or be eligible to meet the General Officer Federal Recognition Board following selection
