**8. Position Description:**

**Duties:**

Responsible for advising Director, Operations and Logistics, and in his absence the Commander, USTRANSCOM, on transportation issues associated with supported command operations, plans, exercises, policies, and procedures

Interacts with Transportation Component Commands (TCC) for additional expertise and advice as needed

Assists the supported Commander's battle staff to facilitate and resolve transportation issues

Participates in actions at the national, DoD, Service, and component command levels to support the command's global transportation mission and ensure both interoperability and peacetime to wartime compatibility.

Provides direction and oversight for all matters dealing with the transportation of hazardous material

Advises on critical transportation and mobility operation issues

Advises on interoperability between DoD and commercial assets, systems, and procedures; and to develop/validate tactics, techniques, and procedures through joint exercises

Identifies those issues affecting the logistics readiness and component commands and advises Director of Operations and Logistics on actions required to correct problems

Assists the Director of Operations and Logistics in exercising operational command and control of assigned forces

Optimizes use of the nation's strategic transportation capability by executing transportation assets to meet National Command Authority Tasking and the nation's security objectives

At the direction of the Director, acts as the DoD center of expertise for operation of the Joint Operations Planning and Execution System (JOPES)

During contingencies and exercises, monitors use of JOPES and provides quality control during active and inactive periods of training throughout the year, under the direction of the Deputy Commander

As a senior RC member within member's parent Service, incumbent may be called upon to represent command, service, departmental and functional positions in community forums

Participates in ongoing humanitarian operations, which require continual operational monitoring

During Wartime, advises the Director of Operations and Logistics on the employment of strategic transportation at the direction of the National Command Authority (NCA) through the JCS. Transportation will be provided to satisfy the needs of a theatre commander to deter war, and if not successful in deterrence, to first deploy forces to halt aggression, then follow-on forces and support to defeat any opposing aggressor. In addition, over 55,000 reserve component personnel could be activated in wartime, and civilian augmentation through the Civil Reserve Air Fleet (CRAF) and the Ready Reserve Force (RRF) would directly impact the Operations and Logistics Directorate

**9. Special Qualifications/Requirements/Restrictions:**

Extensive operations and logistics experience

Individual must have knowledge of sea, land, and air transportation and rapid decision-making abilities

Joint or unified command staff experience is desirable

In-depth understanding of how joint activities and commands operate, and the degree to which coordination is required is mandatory

Experience in working and negotiating with the civilian transportation industry is also extremely important

Understanding of how the civilian transportation industry operates and an appreciation to the high degree of coordination required is essential because the DoD is dependent on the civil sector for 85 percent of its go-to-war transportation capability

Command at Colonel or GO level is required

Ability to analyze strategic requirements to optimize use of intermodalism and containerization

Must have 17 years satisfactory service

This position is M-Day/drill status only

Must be able to complete a minimum 3 years in the assignment before mandatory removal date/mandatory separation date (MRD/MSD)

Completion of senior service school required

Must be Federally recognized in the authorized grade (line), hold a Certificate of Eligibility for the authorized grade (line), pending Senate confirmation in the authorized grade, or be eligible to meet the General Officer Federal Recognition Board following selection
