Duties:

Serves as the principal advisor to the Commanding General (CG), Chief of the National Guard Bureau (CNGB), and the Director, Army National Guard (DARNG) on all issues relative to manning, equipping, training, and maintaining the 91st TSD as it pertains to the ARNG, also works with the Adjutant General of the assigned states

The 91st TSD consists of approximately 3200 authorized personnel consisting of Dept of Army civilians, Active component (AC), and Reserve component (RC) soldiers organized into four 0-6 commanded training support brigades

Coordinates and interfaces with the National Guard Bureau (NGB), State Adjutant General, and other agencies as appropriate to ensure required training support is provided to RC units

Assists in the planning, conduct and evaluation of lanes training exercises and simulations supported battle command and staff training exercises for the RC units throughout a 12 state area

Reviews all exercise requests and changes to assure maximum training benefit

Ensures that principal focus is on priority units: Force Support Package (FSP); Round-out; latest arrival date (LAD) less than 30 days; and enhanced Separate Brigades (eSB) at several training sites, predominately in the western half of the Continental United States (CONUS)

Responsible for coordination and oversight of Stabilization Force (SFOR) or other major mobilization operations affecting the TSD

Upon mobilization, oversees training support for mobilized units as directed by the CG

9. Special Qualifications/Requirements/Restrictions:

Extensive knowledge of the Army, its organization and its training management systems including Reserve Component training capabilities, requirements, and methodology

Ability to assist the Division Commander in commanding a multi-component unit and building/maintaining relationships with a broad spectrum of RC customer units

Ability to establish and maintain appropriate command, operational control, and administrative control relationships with USAR Command (USARC), CONUS Armies, NGB and Forces Command (FORSCOM)

Officers interested in being considered for the dual-hat position must be from the TSD area which consist of the following states: Arizona, California, Colorado, Idaho, Montana, North Dakota, Nevada, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah, Washington and Wyoming (Continued)
